



Prohibition began on January 17, 1920, when the Volstead Act went into effect. For almost fourteen years, Americans were forced to find loopholes in the law that would allow them to enjoy their libations with friends & loved ones. "Private Clubs" were an effort to exploit the rule that drinking in one's own home was never illegal during prohibition. These clubs argued that they were private venues, owned by the members, who consumed their own liquor inside. Many such clubs offered locker rentals to their members which they would use to store their spirits.

As a throwback to the prohibition era, Amendment XVIII offers exclusive membership to guests so that they may fully enjoy the speakeasy experience as well as a few additional perks.
